The following information has been provided prior to the selection day for midwifery. Please ensure that you have read and understand what will be expected of you as a student midwife on the Middlesex University Midwifery Programme – including the implications of each of these aspects on this professional programme.

<b>Placements during the midwifery programme will include a range of shifts including early, late, weekends, bank holidays, night shifts and on calls.</b>
<b>Classes and placements during the midwifery programme will be in a variety of locations across London, and there is limited or no parking at these venues</b>
<b>Placements maybe at a variety of Trusts – not all will be at a student’s named Trust</b>
<b>Although offered a choice of NHS Trust there can be no guarantee that students will get a place in their Trust of first choice</b>
<b>negotiable and do not include ‘half-terms’</b>
<b>Midwifery involves providing personal care to a variety of patients, (both male and female) and students will be learning these skills while on placements</b>
<b>It is understood that the full uniform policy of local Trusts must be adhered to when on practice placements</b>
<b>I understand the expectations of being a student on a full time professional programme and will plan accordingly for this</b>
<b>There is a Nursing and Midwifery Council requirement that any and all missed time (whether clinical or theoretical) has to be made up in order to complete the midwifery programme.</b>
<b>Punctuality is vital both in relation to class and clinical placement</b>
<b>I understand that the course starts on <span style="color: purple;">Monday 11th September 2023</span> and attendance during welcome weeks is compulsory.</b>
